If possible arrange candles, a crucifix and a Gospel or Sunday Missal on a table.

Introduction

Today we are reminded not to be afraid but to have courage and proclaim the message of the Gospel.

Make the Sign of the Cross – a sign of the love God has for us.

An adult lights the candles.

Penitential Act

Ask the children to think about how they have behaved in the past week. Especially when our daily routines are different just now. Have you shown patience to those around you? Have you been kind and helpful even when you don't feel like it and it's difficult?

Lead the children in singing the "Sorry Song".

Lead a Discussion on the Gospel

In today's Gospel we are reminded not to be afraid but to spread the love of God wherever we go.

Sometimes it's very tricky to do things that we are afraid of, we have all sorts of emotions. Discuss these with the children (Fear, nervous, butterflies in our tummies)

At times we may have these feelings about things we know we should not be doing but we can also experience these feelings with things that are good although they scare us. (Discuss with the children the times they may have experienced these: performing in a school show, maybe a solo talk at school, going to a new place we've never been before, performing in front of a crowd)

When we have these feelings they usually fade and change to happiness and excitement when the experience that has made us afraid is over. At times we realise it wasn't as bad as we first thought it would be.

When Jesus sent the Apostles out into the world to share his love they travelled to places they had never been before. How do you think they felt? (Scared, nervous, afraid) However, they were very brave and did what Jesus asked them to.

What did Jesus leave them with to help prepare them? He left them with the gift of the Holy Spirit and that same Spirit is with us also and helps us when we are afraid. We can call on the God to come and guide and protect us.

Just as the Apostles were asked to share the message of God's love with others, we too are given the same mission! We do this not only through our words but also through our actions, wherever we go and towards all those we meet. We are asked to show the love of Christ.
