1 November 2020 - Solemnity of All Saints

If possible arrange candles, a crucifix and a Gospel or Sunday Missal on a table.

Introduction

Today we celebrate the feast of All Saints – the day when we remember everyone who has led a good life and is now in Heaven. This includes the well known Saints recognised by the Church, but most especially today, the ordinary people who have tried their best to live as Jesus taught us and having died, are now with Him forever in Heaven.

Make the Sign of the Cross – a sign of the love God has for us.

An adult lights the candles.

Penitential Act

Ask the children to think about how they have behaved in the past week. Especially when our daily routines are different just now. Have you shown patience to those around you? Have you been kind and helpful even when you don't feel like it and it's difficult?

Lead the children in singing the "Sorry Song" (sung to tune of Frere Jacques)

We are sorry,
Truly sorry,
Heal us Lord,
In Your love,
Help us to do better, Help us to be kinder. Forgive us,

Forgive us.

Gloria (Sung)

Glory to God in the highest,

and peace to His people on earth.

A reading from the Holy Gospel According to St. Matthew

All say "Glory to You Oh Lord" while making a cross on your forehead, on your lips and on your heart.

Read the Gospel aloud to the children. At the end say: "The Gospel of the Lord."

All reply: "Praise to You Lord Jesus Christ."

Lead a Discussion on the Gospel

What did you hear in today's Gospel?

Build on the points that the children remember. Be sure to include the following:

What did Jesus teach the disciples in this gospel?

He said that people who are peaceful, humble, merciful and do God's will are children of God and will be granted the kingdom of Heaven.

What does it mean to be peaceful?

If we are peaceful in God's eyes we are kind, help others, forgive others and generally do what God asks us to do. By doing what God asks and knowing we are doing his will, he gives us a peaceful heart.

When can we think about God and feel peaceful?

We can do this when we say our prayers or when we are unhappy, angry or confused. If we pray to God to help us he will grant us peace and show us the way.

Do you know people that make you feel peaceful? What are they like? How does being peaceful help others?

Peaceful people are calm, kind, honest and fair. They make you feel safe and happy. Even pets like to be around peaceful people.

What will you do in the next week to peaceful?
