

Second Sunday of Lent Year B –28th February 2021

Preparation

If possible arrange candles, a crucifix and a gospel or Sunday Missal on a table.

Introduction

Today is the second Sunday of Lent. (Ask the children if they can tell you what we mean by Lent?) Remind them that it is a time of forty days of preparation for Easter, beginning on Ash Wednesday.

In Lent, we do three things to bring us closer to God, so that we may truly celebrate the joy of Easter. During Lent we **PRAY** more, we **FAST** (give up something we like), and we show love or **CHARITY** to those around us by being generous and sharing and not being selfish. The most important of these three actions is prayer.

As we gather at home today we thank God for our families, and for the time we spend together in prayer. We do this today, knowing that God is with us, helping us always especially when times are difficult.

In today's Gospel we hear about when Jesus went up a mountain to pray taking with him Peter, James and John. We hear how His appearance miraculously changed and He was "transfigured" and we also hear a message from God the Father.

Let's begin our prayers:

Make the Sign of the Cross – a sign of the love God has for us.

An adult lights the candles.

Penitential Act

Adults and children think about how you have behaved in the past week. Especially when your daily routines are different just now- have you shown patience to those around you? Have you been kind and helpful even when you don't feel like it and it's difficult?

Lead the children in singing the "Sorry Song".

We are sorry,
Truly sorry,
Heal us Lord,
In Your love,
Help us to do better, (sung to tune of Frere Jacques)
Forgive us,
Forgive us.

NO Gloria DURING LENT

All stand to welcome the Gospel singing together the **Gospel Acclamation:**

"Share your word with us, Oh Lord, (to the tune of London Bridge
Us Oh Lord, is Falling Down)
Us Oh Lord,
Share Your Word with us, O Lord.
Help us listen."⁽¹⁾

Gospel (Mark 9:2-10)

Explain and demonstrate– **make three crosses: one on your forehead, one on your lips and one on your heart** (in this way we think God's word, speak God's word and keep God's word in our hearts) **as we say together**

"Glory to You, O Lord."

Read the Gospel aloud to the children. At the end say: “**The Gospel of the Lord**”.

All reply: “**Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ**”. Ask everyone to be seated.

Lead a Discussion on the Gospel

Where did Jesus go in this week's Gospel, and who went with Him?
(Jesus went up a mountain with Peter, James and John)
Why did Jesus go up the mountain?(To pray)

What happened to Jesus while He was praying? (He was “transfigured”. This means that His appearance changed and His clothing shone white. He appeared as He will look in glory in Heaven).

Who else was there? (Moses and Elijah)

Who was the voice from the cloud and what important message did He tell us? (The voice was God the Father and he told that Jesus is His “beloved Son” and that we must “Listen to Him.”)

How do you think that Peter, James and John felt seeing and hearing this? (They were amazed, but also frightened. They had seen Jesus as He is in Heaven and were very happy. Then they heard the voice of God His heavenly Father coming from the cloud, and they were frightened. After seeing and hearing this they knew that Jesus was truly the Son of God).

How can we “listen” to Jesus during Lent? (By choosing to do good things: especially remembering to **pray**, and to **fast** by giving up something we like and to show **charity** to others by not being selfish and by being kind and generous).

Discuss how your first week in Lent has gone:
What extra prayers/devotions have you made this week?
What things have you given up?
Have you remembered to be kind each other?

Remember – if you're tempted to give up- ask Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph, to help you to try your best.

Prayers of the Faithful

You may wish to prepare some of these yourselves or ask the children for their prayers. Here are some suggestions for today:

Lord Jesus, help us to try our best during Lent to **fast** by giving up something that we like.

Lord, in Your mercy.
All reply: "**Hear our prayer.**"

Lord Jesus, everyday we thank you for your blessings of food and water, a home and clothes to wear.

Lord, in Your mercy.
All reply: "**Hear our prayer.**"

Lord Jesus, help us to show charity by not being selfish and being kind and generous to others especially those who are different to us.

Lord, in Your mercy.
All reply: "**Hear our prayer.**"

We now pray together saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
Hallowed be thy name:
Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done
On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
And forgive us our trespasses,
As we forgive those who trespass against us:
And lead us not into temptation,
But deliver us from evil. **Amen.**

We can also say the following prayer as a **Spiritual Communion.**

(Anyone can do this at any age. Even if you have not made your first Sacramental Holy Communion, or are unable to receive the sacrament of Holy Communion, you can still make a Spiritual communion by saying this prayer).

Spiritual Communion (Prayer of St Alphonsus Liguori)

My Jesus,
I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You Sacramentally,
Come at least spiritually into my soul.
I embrace You as if You were already come,
And I unite myself wholly to You.
Never permit me to be separated from You. **Amen.**

Closing Prayer

Dear Jesus help us to follow You every day and to **listen** when
You call our names.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen
