Gospel

*Matthew 28:1-10 From Sunday Book of Readings
The Lectionary Adapted for Children P.45*

A reading from the Holy Gospel According to St. Matthew

All say "Glory to You Oh Lord" while making a cross on your forehead, on your lips and on your heart.

Read the Gospel aloud and at the end say:

The Gospel of the Lord

All say : Praise to You Lord Jesus Christ

Lead a Discussion on the Gospel

Today we celebrate Easter- ask the children what they think of when they hear the word Easter. (They may make reference to eggs, this is a good chance to remind them that these represent the stone of the tomb that Jesus rolled away)

Explain that Easter is the most important celebration in our Church because of what we heard in today's Gospel.

Remind them of the events leading up to Easter. On Holy Thursday Jesus celebrated the Last Supper and left us with the gift of Priesthood and his own Body and Blood in the form of the Sacraments of the Most Holy Eucharist.

On Good Friday, Jesus took on the sins of the world and was crucified and died. This filled us with great sadness.

In today's Gospel we hear how Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James went to the tomb. There was an earthquake and an Angel appeared and moved the stone away from the entrance to the tomb! (How do you think they felt and reacted? Fear, panic)

Ask the children what happened next?(The angel told the women not to be afraid and that Jesus was alive and had risen from the dead on the third day as He had told them. The angel showed the women the place where the body of Jesus had been and that the tomb was now empty.)

What did the angel tell the women to do?(To go and tell the disciples that Jesus had risen from the dead and to go to Galilee where they will see Jesus).

What happened next? (The women were leaving to tell the disciples when they met Jesus! Jesus also tells them to tell the disciples they have seen a Him and that they must go to Galilee where they will see a Him too).

When Jesus rose from the dead, he overcame death as it once was for us all. By his rising he has allowed us to enjoy eternal life with his father in Heaven. His dying, destroyed death and that is why Easter is the greatest celebration of all.

What kind of things can you do at Easter to show your great appreciation to Jesus for what he did for us? (The main thing you can do is show his

love to others by the way you act and live your lives every single day. Trust in him and spread his love with everyone you meet. Pray for those in need, especially the sick and lonely and those suffering because of war).
