St Mary, Star of the Sea, Leith

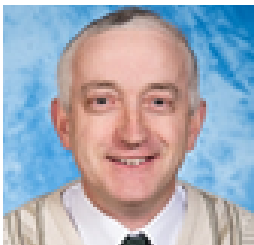
