



About The Bible

Three thousand, five hundred years ago, God began instructing men to write down His words. Over the next fifteen hundred years, God continued to speak, and many men recorded these messages.

The early writings were called the "Law" and the "Prophets." These, and the rest of God's words recorded on scrolls, became known as the "Scriptures."

Today these same writings, bound together in one book are called the "Bible."


What makes the Bible so amazing, special and important?

- There has never been a book written in the same way as the Bible!
- The Bible was written by over 40 authors.
- The authors who wrote it came from 3 different continents: Asia, Africa and Europe.
- They wrote from many different places: wilderness, prison, islands and whilst travelling.
- They wrote it at different times, covering a span of 1,500 years.
- They did different kinds of jobs: fishermen, kings, shepherds, a herdsman, a politician, a doctor, a tax collector, a rabbinical scholar and more.
- They all wrote about the same thing!

How many books have you read?

The Bible is very different from all of them.

- The Bible is very old, it was written over a time period of approximately 1,500 years!
- While it is very old, the Bible is still relevant for today.
- It is the most widely read book ever, the all-time Best-Selling Book!
- Many people, and several governments, have attempted to stop people from reading the Bible.
- The Bible is the most loved book of all time.
- There are more translations of the Bible into different languages than any other book.
- There are more handwritten copies of the Bible still in existence than any other old writing.



The Bible Quiz

The Bible is a collection of books which are separated into the Old Testament (OT) which records God's teachings before the time of Jesus and the New Testament (NT) which records God's teachings after the birth of Jesus.




