Two days later there was a wedding in the town of Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there. Jesus and his followers were also invited to the wedding. When all the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have

no more wine."

Jesus answered, "Dear woman, why come to me? My time has not yet come."

His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you to do."

In that place there were six stone water jars. The Jews used jars like these in their washing ceremony. Each jar held about 20 or 30 gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." So, they filled the jars to the top. Then he said to them, "Now take some out and give it to the master of the feast."

The messages the Blessed Virgin Mary gave at Lourdes, France in 1858 are summarised as follows:

- 1. It is an appreciation from heaven of the definition of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, declared four years prior (in 1854). At the same time, she presents herself as Mother and model of purity for the world in need of this virtue.
- 2. It is an exaltation to the virtues of poverty and humility accepted in a Christian way by having chosen Bernadette as an instrument of her messages.
- 3. An important message in Lourdes is the Cross. The Blessed Mother repeats that the most important thing is to be happy in the other life, even though it is necessary to accept the Cross to achieve happiness.
- 4. The importance of prayer, the rosary, penance, and humility (kissing the ground as a sign); a message of infinite mercy for sinners and for the care of the sick.

Important points for reflection about the visible signs in the first apparition which include great spiritual teachings:

- 1. Surrounded by light: this is a symbol of the light of faith which we receive at Baptism. Faith is the light of life with which we should shine before the world. We should transmit the brilliance of faith by our sanctity of life.
- 2. The light was tranquil and profound: in our Christian faith we find repose for our souls.
- 3. Of incomparable beauty, there is nothing like it here on earth: work unceasingly to acquire the true beauty of soul so that it is pleasing for God to contemplate.
- 4. White dress, pure and delicate, never has anyone been able to imitate: our soul should be dressed in purity and be delicate before God; sin stains our white dress.
- 5. Bare feet, on top of which is a brilliant rose: bare feet preach to us about the evangelical poverty of the Gospels which is a beautiful and sublime virtue that to those who practice it Jesus has promised himself the Kingdom of Heaven. The luminous rose is a call to be the fragrance of Christ to all, the divine fragrance of the Gospels.
- 6. Her hands always together, with the Holy Rosary in fervent prayer, praying always without ceasing prayer is our constant nourishment, the breath of our soul, all the virtues are born in the soul that prays.

The Torchlight Marian Procession

The Torchlight Marian Procession takes place each evening at 9.00 pm as it has since 1872.

The welcoming of pilgrims and announcements begin at 20.45. The Evening Procession begins from the Priory and ends in the square in front of the Rosary Basilica. Between

torches, pilgrims carry a statue of Our Lady (a copy of the Cabuchet statue of the Blessed Virgin).

During the Procession, the pilgrims walk in groups behind their pilgrimage banner. Everyone is invited to carry an illuminated candle in their hand - a reminder of Baptism.

At the end of the Procession, the Priests and Bishops present give the Blessing.

The Rosary is not a prayer wheel, and it does not encourage the repetition with the lips of ready-made formulae. It is with the aid of these words that we enter into the life of

Christ, remembering his birth, this childhood (Joyful Mysteries), his adult life, his death (Sorrowful Mysteries) and his resurrection (Glorious Mysteries). It is a means of coming closer to him.


The Mass at 11.00pm in the Grotto

After the Procession, the pilgrims are invited to attend the last Mass of the day at the Grotto of the Apparition. The celebrant chooses his theme from the Masses in Honour of Our Lady or from the Masses for Various Needs and Occasions. This Mass is to give thanks for all the graces received at the Sanctuary during the day.

This Mass at the Grotto is celebrated every day, including Sunday, from the beginning of the Pilgrimage Season. The Mass will be celebrated in French or Italian.

Practical Information

- The procession lasts about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours.
- It is possible for pilgrims to recite the Rosary in different languages. They must present themselves in front of the Rosary Basilica 30 minutes before the Procession begins.
- To take part in the Choir it is necessary to present oneself in front of the Rosary Basilica no later than 8.30pm. It is open to pilgrims of all languages.
- Candles are bought in the town before entering the Sanctuary.




Instructions:

- 4. Glue the host above the chalice making sure the door opens the correct way. Draw a cross on the outside of the host.


Template 1 for Holy Eucharist Craft

• Gifts of the Holy Spirit - Active Lesson (2)

- Knowledge is the gift that helps us to know ourselves and the world around us. It helps us to know where our faith is leading us and what our church is about. "Knowledge" is the gift that makes us smart about ourselves. [smarties]
- The gift of Understanding helps us to untie the knots, to straighten out our lives, to deal with our problems. "Understanding" is letting the Word of God have room in our lives. [pretzels]
- Wisdom is the gift of the Holy Spirit that helps us to see and understand God's plan in our lives and in the world. It helps us to say, "Aha, I finally understand." [AHA card]
- Fortitude is the gift of the Holy Spirit that helps us walk out into the world and feel prepared. It
 gives us the stick-to-it-iveness to stand up for what we believe. [gum]
- Piety is the gift of the Holy Spirit that helps us to see God in everything around us. It teaches us to treat our fragile world gently. [flower petal]
- Fear of the Lord is the gift of the Holy Spirit that keeps us awestruck by the power and beauty of God in our lives. "Wonder" and awe explode like a starburst when we let the Holy Spirit into our lives.
- Counsel is the gift of the Holy Spirit that encourages us to talk things over so that we can make choices that let us feel comfortable with ourselves afterwards. "Right Judgment" keeps us from feeling like suckers. [suckers]

Growing with the gifts of the Holy Spirit

At times it seems difficult, if not impossible to follow Christ and his commandments. We are attracted to his goodness and love, and we want to grow strong in virtue, but we are weak and tempted to sin. How can we do what God asks of us?

Certainly, we cannot do it on our own strength, and, fortunately, God does not expect us to. One of the ways he helps us is through what the Church calls the "Gifts of the Holy Spirit". The very nature of a gift is that it is free and unearthed; so it is with these seven gifts. They came to you at your Baptism and will be strengthened in you when you receive the sacrament of Confirmation. These gifts help us primarily by preparing our hearts to obey God.





Margaret changed her husband and the country for the better. Malcolm was good, but he and his court were very rough. When he saw how wise his wife was, he willingly listened to her good advice.



- Islam is the second most popular religion in the world with over a thousand million followers. It is more often thought of as a complete way of life rather than a religion.
- Islam began in Arabia and was revealed to humanity by the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him). Those who follow Islam are called Muslims. Muslims believe that there is only one God, called Allah.
- The prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him), who was born in A.D. 570 at Mecca, in Saudi Arabia, is often regarded as the founder of Islam. He was the last prophet to be sent by Allah. However, the first prophet was Adam.
- peace be upon him Muhammad is so revered that it is usual to make this statement every time his name is mentioned.
- Muslims believe Allah had a plan for you before you were born, and He still has a
 plan for you. Allah's plan for you is necessary and glorious. His plan is vital to your
 success and important to the world.

Muslims believe - Allah has a flexible plan for each human being: a plan that allows that person to benefit the world with his/her unique talents.

When people go into the mosque, they take off their shoes. This is to keep it clean for prayer.

There is often a fountain or pool, or at least an area with water where people can wash (wudu). Muslim wash their hands, mouth, throat, nose, ears, arms up to the elbow and feet. This is a sacred wash that symbolises spiritual cleansing and purity in readiness for coming before God.
